

Unique display to dazzle the senses

A colourful collaborative art exhibition is now on display at Coonabarabran's SPACE.

The exhibition "Inhalare - breathe upon" aims to transform familiar landscapes into unfamiliar territories.

Six artists provided a soundscape (short audio recording) along with a written submission - both pieces describing a part of nature.

These items were then

passed onto a further six artists for inspiration, where they were invited to put together a visual art piece for display.

SPACE Gallery director Allison Reynolds said the display drew its uniqueness from promoting multiple senses within the exhibition.

"What makes it

different is we look at accessibility and inclusion and if you are sight or vision impaired you can still experience this exhibition," she said.

There are 18 pieces currently on show at SPACE.

Visitors are encouraged to utilise the headphones and listen to the audio

descriptions as they take in the visual representations.

The exhibition will be on display until 15 June.

A closing event will be held where some of the artists will travel to Coonabarabran for a meet and greet session.
